# MATCH PREVIEW

THERE'S NO PLACE like home as the Wanderers return to Bankwest Stadium tonight for the first time in almost a month to play Newcastle Jets in a vital Round 19 Hyundai A-League clash.

Following a resounding 3-1 win over the Central Coast Mariners on 2nd February, the Red & Black will be looking to continue to build momentum under interim head coach Jean-Paul de Marigny.

The Wanderers will go into the game fresh given the postponement of last week's Sydney Derby because of the state of the ground, something that has allowed de Marigny even more time to work with the squad.

The eighth-placed Wanderers (17 points) have plenty to play for as they look to make a late charge towards the A-League Finals.

They are just five points off sixth spot held by Brisbane Roar, but the Queenslanders have played one extra game.

With Nicolai Muller leading the way, the Red & Black produced one of their best performances of the season against the Mariners in Gosford. They were well organised in both attack and defence and there was plenty of hunger and belief.

Among the many positives to emerge from the win was the debut of marquee striker Simon Cox, who came off the bench midway through the second half.

Despite only being in the country a matter of weeks, the former Irish international had an immediate impact, earning a penalty that saw Mitchell Duke convert from the spot.

Cox then made certain of the three points by scoring late in the game after a swift Wanderers' counter attack.

The marksman, who was in line to start in the Sydney Derby had the game gone ahead, will be fitter for that run and better acclimatised given the extra week of training.

Having lost to the Jets away in the first round, the Wanderers will be looking to exact some revenge. However, it is likely to be a tough encounter.

History shows that games against the Jets are usually evenly contested and hard fought. They have met 22 times with both teams recording eight wins apiece with six draws.

The Jets are also coming off a win against the Mariners and will have a new coach at the helm so they will be keen to impress the new boss as well as attempting to get off the bottom of the table. **W**

IT'S BEEN A history making season already for our Wander Women but it's important for us to stay grounded and make sure we don't get too far ahead of ourselves.

Thanks to a bye round last week, we've had a solid two weeks to prepare for tonight's Sydney Derby at Cromer Park.

# COX READY TO BE UNLEASHED

## HAVE THE WANDERERS FOUND THE MISSING PIECE IN THEIR PUZZLE?

IT HAS BEEN only three weeks since Simon Cox touched down in Western Sydney and it's no surprise that he's already made an immediate impact.

The experienced marksman boasts an extensive resume of playing in more than 500 matches in all competitions in England and has close to 100 goals to his name.

Cox has hit double figures on the goal scoring tally in his last three seasons overseas and is known to be a no-fuss, passionate, routine goal scorer.

A player that wears his heart on his sleeve, doing anything that he can for his teammates, Cox made the big decision in January to leave the comforts of England to move across the world to the unknowns of Western Sydney.

The unknowns of a new training ground and new teammates were quickly put to bed with the striker acclimatising quickly to life in Western Sydney thanks to the help of his teammates.

"I've found my feet quite nicely and pretty quickly actually, it's a lot easier for me when you come into a group and they're welcoming," explained Cox.

"With the game being called off on the weekend (Sydney Derby), obviously it wasn't great as everyone was looking forward to that but it gave us a chance to put some good work in on the training ground.

“Apart from the weather recently, it's been really good.”

Doing his research before committing to a club on the other side of the world, Cox spoke to former teammates who had played in the Hyundai A-League to gain an understanding of what to expect from both the competition and the club.

“I spoke to a few people who had played over here before and they only said good things about the Wanderers and about the stadium, but then when I came here to the training ground I was really surprised,” said Cox.

“I wasn't expecting the level of facilities that are here, so I was really pleased with that.

“Because the training ground is where we do our work, this is where we are at more times than we are at home.

“So I'm a big believer that the training ground has to have a good environment for everybody to want to do good work.”

After only a week's worth of training sessions, Cox was thrown straight into action in the Wanderers away match against Central Coast Mariners.

There was plenty for Cox to get used to.

From the pre-match meal, transport to the game and the palm trees at Central Coast Stadium.

“We came here to the Wanderers Centre of Football, had a pre-match meal, had a meeting and then we left on the bus to go to the game.

"I'm very new to this when it comes to how long it takes to get to games, so we were just chatting on the bus on what to expect.

"Then you pull up to a stadium with palm trees in the background and you think what's going on here?

"It was a lovely stadium, the pitch was decent and obviously I wasn't expecting to start as I was only here for a week so it was nice to get off the bench and get a significant amount of minutes in and help the boys get three significant points.

"It's been a good start, and now I want a bit more of that."

A good start is certainly an understatement.

The marksman had an immediate impact in the Central Coast, winning the Wanderers a penalty and scoring a goal in the Red &

Black's comprehensive 3-1 win over the Central Coast.

Having now had a taste of what is expected in being a Wanderer, Cox has been counting down the days until his debut at Wanderland.

"I'm not here to sit and watch, I've come here to play, score goals and help the team achieve good things.

"The ambition from the top is that we need to make the finals and if I can help the whole team be successful then that's what I'm here to do.

"I'm looking forward to the challenges ahead and you can see that if you do win a game, you can close the gap a bit quicker and we're looking forward to the task ahead."

And what better place to close the gap on the ladder than Wanderland? **W**

# HAPPIER HARRISON

IT WAS A DIFFICULT DECISION AT FIRST, BUT AMY HARRISON COULDN'T BE HAPPIER THAT SHE'S RED & BLACK

WITH HER EXPERIENCE and the sublime quality of her football, the classy Matildas midfielder has been pivotal in the emergence of the Wanderers as a force in the Westfield W-League this season.

Harrison's signing was one of the key moves by Wanderers head coach Dean Heffernan and his assistants Michael Beauchamp and Cath Cannuli.

But, it took a little bit of procrastination before Harrison eventually decided to make the move from defending champions and bitter rivals Sydney FC to their crosstown rivals.

"It has been good. I love it," Harrison said of her season so far with the Wanderers.

"I am really happy with the decision I made.

"I think the club is really going in the right direction and everyone here is just so levelled headed, so caring, so respectful.

"Obviously that comes from the coaching staff down. It is such a great group of girls and I couldn't be happier.

"For sure, it was (a big decision).

"I didn't have the greatest season with Sydney last year and, to be honest, I never thought I would leave Sydney yet alone come to their rivals.

"I spoke to Nules (Catherine Cannuli) a little while ago and Dean.

"I didn't know how to choose, I didn't know what I was going to do so then I said I'll just stay at Sydney, but I just couldn't bring myself to sign (there).

"I knew then and there I wasn't going to go back. I spoke to Dean again and made the decision."

The move to the Wanderers has been a blessing for the 23-year-old, who is hoping the move out west will help her refocus and kick start her career with the Matildas.

Capped 10 times for her country, Harrison admits it is hard to look on while the Matildas are in camp preparing for the Olympic Games qualifiers.

"I love Sydney and I always will because it has been such a big part of my life and career, but you have to move on at some point," said Harrison.

"While I have such good memories there I think now is

perfect time to be here, to refresh and live the game more than I did and be around new people and evolve as a person as well.

"Being at the Wanderers gives me more motivation to get myself back in there (the Matildas) and do all I can to get back there."

As one of the high profile signings at the Wanderers, Harrison is cognisant of the expectations on her.

But, the heavy burden of expectation is not something she allows to get into her mindset.

"There's a lit bit of it (expectation)," Harrison said. "At Sydney there's a lot more bigger personalities.

"But, everyone here is equal and treated exactly the same no matter who you are, whether you are a visa player, a Matilda or a train on. We are such a close-knit group.

"The most important thing is that everyone here is a good person.

"We all get along so well and our team morale is probably one of the best I have ever been involved with in my career and I think that helps.

"That's why I like here so much, there's no hierarchy. You are respected no matter who you are and that's all that matters."

With the regular season drawing to an end and the finals rapidly approaching, the Wanderers face a tough finish to the season with games against Sydney FC, Melbourne City and Perth Glory still to come.

It's a daunting task, especially for a club that is looking to play finals football for the first time, but one Harrison believes the Wanderers will relish and hold them in good stead.

"Obviously in the finals you are going to be playing the Sydney's and City's so, if anything, it is the best preparation we could have asked for," added Harrison.

"But, then again every team on their day can win.

"We lost to Adelaide which was probably not our best game but then we can beat Sydney 5-0. It's who is there on the day and who is going to perform.

"But, its the perfect preparation for us going in (to the finals)." **W**

# NEWBON MAKING MOST OF CHANCE

COURTNEY NEWBON COULD HARDLY BELIEVE HER EYES AS SHE WALKED OUT ON TO BANKWEST STADIUM FOR HER WANDERERS WESTFIELD W-LEAGUE DEBUT LAST MONTH

IT WAS A special moment for the girl from Tasmania as she took her place in goals for the game against Perth Glory, which the Wanderers eventually won 3-1.

To play her first senior game for the Red & Black was a special achievement in itself, but, as she put it "to do it at a Stadium like Bankwest was amazing".

"It was a bit nerve racking, but exciting just the same," said Newbon.

But when Smith injured her knee, head coach Dean Heffernan had no qualms elevating Newbon into the role for the Perth game and she responded with a quality performance.

Newbon, who came to Sydney from Tasmania with her family at a very

young age and is a product of the Sutherland Shire, paid tribute to the injured Smith, saying the American had been a huge influence on her.

"She has been a great help to me," said Newbon.

"We tend to bounce off each other. So if something comes up in training she might see it one way and I might see it another.

"So we kind of bounce it around and kind of come to something that might work better. For sure she has been an influence."

Newbon's second stint at the Wanderers came about after she was invited to trial with the club last year following a good season with Sydney University.

"(Assistant Wanderers coach) Cath (Cannuli) contacted me and said they would like me to have a trial," said Newbon.

"So I gladly took the opportunity and the rest is history."

Newbon has thrived in the wonderful environment at the Wanderers.

"It's just fantastic here. I am super happy to be part of this team. The environment and atmosphere is just amazing," added Newbon.

"The set up here is incredible ... The facilities, the staff, you couldn't ask for anything better.

"The support is just fantastic." ❏

# YOUNG GUNS ON OLYMPIC STAGE

TWO WANDERERS HAVE TAKEN A GIANT STEP TOWARDS PLAYING IN THE BIGGEST TOURNAMENT OF THEIR CAREERS

DEFENDER TASS MOURDOUKOUTAS and midfielder Keanu Baccus played pivotal roles in helping the Olyroos qualify for the Olympics for the first time in 12 years.

Both played the full 90 minutes as Australia beat Uzbekistan 1-0 in the play-off for third and fourth spot at the AFC Under 23s championships in Thailand.

Despite the gruelling schedule and tough conditions, the duo figured in most of the games in the tournament with coach Graham Arnold showing great faith in their ability to contribute to the success of the team.

Baccus, who described the feeling of qualifying as "one of the best of my career", praised the camaraderie in the squad, revealing they were a close-knit unit that was devoid of egos and negativity.

"Everyone was there determined to achieve good things. It was a great group of boys that was aiming for the same target," said Baccus.

"Hopefully, we can bring that sort of similar culture back and show what the Wanderers are really made of."

Mourdoukoutas echoed those sentiments.

"For sure there we no big egos and it is a big reason why teams are successful in general, but especially this team," said the defender.

"If there were boys not willing to give 100 percent on any given day then we may have lost a game and not gone through.

"It was a long tournament and not easy to keep your mind focussed every day so you needed the support and the group around you."

The Olyroos qualified from their group for the knock out stage, going on to beat Syria in a Quarter Final before losing 2-0 to a red hot South Korea in a Semi Final.

However, the Australians still had another chance to qualify for Tokyo. It meant they had to beat Uzbekistan in the play-off for third and fourth spot.

Nick D'Agostino's second half goal was enough to do the job. As the full-time whistle blew, it was something Mourdoukoutas and Baccus will never forget.

"The emotion just took over and once we made the quarter finals we knew it was well and truly on," said Mourdoukoutas.

"We had a good test against Syria and got past them.

"Then we knew we had two shots. We knew Korea were a strong side and massive credit to them. They played well and

deservedly won the tournament.


"But, at the end of the day, we gave ourselves the best chance with the two games. We just had to beat Uzbekistan and when that final whistle blew it was unbelievable. Emotion took over.

"Just to know everyone back home, family, friends, relatives, the Wanderers, the fans were all proud of us was just something very special."

Baccus and Mourdoukoutas had slow starts to the tournament but both agreed they grew into it.

"For me, it was tough at the start," admitted Baccus.

"It was really muggy and humid. The sun is not as harsh as it is here, but I was struggling to get going.

"But, for sure I grew into the tournament. I got rested for the second game but then I kicked on and got going." 


